### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### LatinTech Was an Incredible Success

This inaugural LatinTech Accelerator was an incredible success, starting with the moment it was announced. As anticipated, the Tampa Latin community fully welcomed the tech founders and lent their expertise in many ways, from event hosting to being Advisory Council members. Accenture hosted a fireside chat luncheon during Global Entrepreneur Week and the City of Clearwater hosted the founders at a luncheon and tour post event. Now Publishing published a collection of personal stories from our Latin startup founders.

This Accelerator attracted the attention of the Miami tech ecosystem and exploratory conversations are underway for a potential future collaboration. National brands also took notice and exploratory conversations are in process about funding supporting a second Accelerator in 2025.

The Welcome Reception was hosted in Tampa's Ybor City Latin Quarter, with business owners, politicians, dignitaries and Gasparilla Pirate Krewe, the Knights of Sant Yago, adding beads, color and history. Congresswoman Kathy Castor and Mayor Jane Castor both provided welcoming remarks and the media featured stories about the Accelerator. Several founders have gone on to present at major conferences, including Christy Cull-Fernandez, who was a panelist for Enterprising Latinas to encourage local Latinas to start their own businesses; she will be a panelist in October on the topic of AI (Artificial Intelligence) at the University of South Florida Women in Leadership & Philanthropy Annual Symposium.

The inaugural cohort included 17 founders representing 15 tech startups recruited from across the US and beyond. More than 180 startups applied, with many referred from Wave ecosystem and network members, including alumni companies. Details are provided on the following pages and this <u>LatinTech web page link</u> showcases sponsors and Advisory Council members. Photos and success stories are also included herein.

As a nonprofit 501(c)(3), Wave takes zero equity from the participating companies. This Accelerator was fully funded by the generous support of the US Economic Development Agency through the Small Business Administration. The 15 startups participated in a multi-week intensive program that included dedicated mentors, one-on-one coaching with notable tech founders, sales training, pitch coaching and investor introductions in an environment designed to support high-scale growth. Beyond the program, the participating companies enjoy ongoing support through Tampa Bay Wave's connections and access to further accelerate company development.

As of this report, collectively, over 500 hours of mentoring and other support have been provided to these companies, as well as invaluable exposure opportunities through press, social media and Wave's signature events that showcased this cohort. Capital raised aggregated \$9.3 Million with 183 new jobs.

### **RECRUITMENT & SELECTION**

#### Successful 1st Year Program

Since Tampa Bay Wave launched its downtown Tampa venture center and accelerator programming in 2013, our region's technology sector has seen transformative change. In just ten short years, the local ecosystem is hardly recognizable as the region regularly boasts about its startups getting national and global attention. With 2023 marking the inaugural year of the LatinTech Accelerator program, Tampa Bay Wave is excited about the fresh perspectives and opportunities this new initiative offers. As a first-year program, LatinTech offers unique benefits, allowing Wave to tap into a vibrant and growing Latin-heritage tech community that brings diverse ideas to Tampa Bay. The program's newness provides flexibility to adapt based on real-time feedback, ensuring it meets the specific needs of Latin-heritage entrepreneurs while establishing strong connections between Tampa Bay and Latin-based tech ecosystems.

#### **Key Recruiting Metrics**

- 349 Total Applications received
- 78% of applications from outside Florida
- 60% of applications from outside the US
- 57 Semi-Finalists selected from initial screenings
- 15 Companies selected for the cohort

#### **Recruiting Efforts**

Wave staff leveraged their extensive national and international network of partners, as well as various media channels, to raise awareness about the CyberTech|X Accelerator program.

- Global and national recruiting partners involved included: Morrow (GAN.co), Gust, F6s, Global Entrepreneurship Network, Startup Champions Network, and others.
- Referrals were received through Wave startups and founder connections, including alumni from the FinTech|X program and members of other Wave accelerator programs.
- Referrals were also obtained from Mentor and Advisory networks associated with Wave.
- Investor networks provided additional referrals.
- Sponsors and Donors contributed referrals as well.
- Community partner referrals and connections were utilized.
- Cold inbound leads were another source of applicants.
- A combination of paid digital advertising campaigns, email marketing, and social media outreach was employed.

#### **Year-Round Recruiting Impact**

The LatinTech Accelerator benefitted from nearly a full-year of recruiting. The importance of **year-round recruiting** cannot be understated because as the accelerator industry knows... the startups choose the program, not the other way around. Wave's reputation as "best in class" ensures top quality applicants bringing viable real world solutions to market.

#### The most market mature cohort in Tampa Bay Wave history

The LatinTech cohort had several experienced serial entrepreneurs, many boasting prior exits (company sales). Combined. the group reflected over **100 years of experience**, some engaged since the dawn of the industry. They also had **collectively raised over \$30 million dollars** prior to entering the program, evidencing the investment market's positive reaction to their offerings.

#### **Continued Success in Recruiting International Startups**

The LatinTech cohort ultimately featured 9 international startups, with applications across the globe. Utilizing international partnerships, particularly, Pro Chile, Wave was able to extend its reach and advance West Central Florida as a valuable emerging tech hub visible globally. Wave's accreditation from Morrow makes Wave top 100 in the world.

### Focused on Expanding Jobs in the US

This cohort has already expanded their teams and added well-paying tech jobs in the US, further advancing and drawing attention to the developing tech ecosystem here. We look forward to upcoming metrics collection periods to monitor those expansions.

#### **EXPANDING CONNECTIONS & REMOVING ECONOMIC BARRIERS**

In 2023, Wave reached out to SouthWest Airlines and Delta Air Lines, requesting their help to help remove an economic barrier for cash-strapped startup founders. While Wave's programs are offered at no charge, the founders pay their own travel expenses to and from Tampa plus their lodging costs. We have long enjoyed being able to offer these traveling founders an incredible discount from the Hyatt House/Hyatt Place hotel next door but the cost of airfare was still a challenge for some. We were honored and delighted when both of these airlines offered us vouchers that we can distribute based on financial need to reduce this economic barrier.

And one unanticipated outcome will be the upcoming announcement of additional direct Delta Air Lines flights from Latin countries to Tampa and Orlando, thereby improving the accessibility and travel experience for future founders. We are seeking funding for a repeat of LatinTech in the coming year and look forward to sharing this great news with those applicants.
